Some Thoughts on Practical Stuff: Rider Education

or

The Newhall Incident and what it means to us

You're thinking, "now what's he talking about"? Well, the Newhall Incident involved four California Highway Patrol Officers and two "untrained' suspects in 1970 just outside of Newhall, Ca. In just under 4 ½ minutes all four officers were dead and the two suspects were gone. You can read several accounts if this on the internet, but long story short, every account points back to poor training, and it sent shockwaves thru the entire law enforcement training community all across the nation. By the time I became a firearms instructor for my department in 1980 this incident had firmly implanted itself in every aspect of police training, especially firearms. Every discussion of firearms training in any training environment I was ever involved with as a lawman always went back to The Newhall Incident.

So what's that got to do with GWRRA Rider Education? It's safe to say that every endeavor that has experience with anything dangerous, whatever the level, have *all* learned the same lesson. Training.

GWRRA Rider Education, and all the associated training from MSF and other fine training folks seek to teach us two things. The first we hear a lot about, the second we have occasion to practice.

The first: This training will teach you how to identify hazardous situations and avoid them. It is most often called "Defensive Driving" and these are the things we know to look for and anticipate down the road, thus giving us enough time to do what's needed to avoid them.

The second: This training is intended to provide you with hands-on opportunity to improve your riding skills. Slow speed turns, weaving, stops, clutch, throttle and brake control are just a few of the things you will learn to improve on while on the driving range.

But all these things seek to get you to one place. One of the officers in the Newhall Incident was thought to have attempted to return fire with a shotgun, however all the rounds in the shotgun were found on the ground, unfired. He had managed to eject all the rounds while trying to get the shotgun to work. Seems he had been issued that shotgun for the first time, with no training, that morning. The analogy is getting on a Wing and riding off with no proper riding instruction. Under any other situation the officer probably would have been able to properly operate the shotgun, just like anyone can get on a motorcycle and ride off. But under the stress of life-ordeath, he failed. Same with the untrained rider.

Every endeavor who has learned this lesson knows the lesson is this: the better the training the better your chances are of surviving a confrontation, whether a bad guy or a bad driver. It is common knowledge among police trainers, and MSF instructors as well, that when you're faced with a stress situation you will revert, without thinking, to your training. Bad, (or no), training bad response. Good training and you'll likely survive. Experience repeatedly proves this to be true.

The quality and quantity of rider education you get *will* directly impact your chances of surviving a situation. That's the plain and simple reason for Rider Education in GWRRA.....

(CD note: I wrote this for our newsletter about this time last year. In light of Russ's article last month I thought it would be good idea to get this out again. The idea being "TRAINING".

Since then there has been significant improvement in our rider education environment in the District. Ted Bates, our District Director, is now a certified MSF instructor, a Rider Edge instructor, and a GWRRA Rider Ed instructor. Rick Howell and Gene Wagner have also been certified in Trike courses. We now have riding instructors who can get us the courses we need and want more readily.

Russ, Keith, Teresa and I are certified GWRRA Seminar course facilitators for Road Captain, Co-rider and other courses provided by GWRRA. The District has made huge progress in improving our Rider Education. Let's take full advantage of these new resources.





We were expecting 300+ Motorcycles in all. Well as luck would have it, on the evening prior Mike received a call from the New Mexico State Police Department that a huge storm front was due to hit right in the middle of our path on I -40 near Gallop. He was told that I -40 would probably be shut down until the storm passed and it could be re-opened. Mike was told that there was no way Motorcycles could get through. It never fails, make all those plans, get everything set up and at the last minute Mother Nature decides to hit us with a big "Whammy". Well now Mike is faced with making a lot of major decisions, in a very short amount of time. He had to contact all the agencies, all personnel who were helping along the route, and give them the bad news that all plans had been canceled due to the weather. The most important folks he had to contact were Greg and Tina to let all the riders coming from the East Coast know what had happened. Mike called and warned them to find alternate routes due to the weather conditions and road closure.




